- Assessment of the young person's 'stage of change' and how this informs intervention
- The importance of identifying risk and protective factors
- · Applying principles of harm reduction
- The importance of systemic, collaborative practice in meeting the needs of high risk young people
- Theories of adolescent development, and how these can help explain risk taking behaviour, as well as inform developmentally appropriate engagement strategies with young people
- · Working from a relationship-based approach
- The importance of reflective practice (including reflection on the 'self' of the practitioner)
