Topic: Interviewing children and young people: lessons from the Royal Commission into sexual abuse in institutional care.

About this paper: "The sexual abuse of a child is intolerable in a civilised society. It is the responsibility of our entire community to acknowledge that children are vulnerable to abuse. We must each resolve that we will do what we can to protect them. The tragic impact of abuse for individuals and through them our entire society demands nothing less" (Royal Commission, 2017 p4). A range of professionals across statutory child protection, family support, education, health, and legal contexts have a significant responsibility to ensure the ongoing safety of children and young people who disclose sexual abuse. Understanding the lessons learned by the Royal Commission will help shape systems, policy and practice approaches into the future.
